There are many things happening in our lives that are against our will and desire. But we can face them with courage for we are given the power of the spoken Word of God to change things for the better.

Elisha demonstrated how the Word of God uttered instantly changed a dire situation

1. Keep your eyes on Jesus and not on the circumstances (Heb 12:2).
 - During the siege of Samaria, in the middle of a severe famine, people were forced to eat their children in desperation. The king of Samaria, gripped with fear, and furious about the situation, blamed God for all that was happening (2 Kings 6:24-33).
 - We will not have to fight this battle. Let us not fear nor be dismayed (2 Chron 20:17).
2. He speaks forth the promises that God has made in His Word.
 - Elisha boldly prophesized that the following day, ten pounds of flour or twenty pounds of barley can be bought for one piece of silver (2 Kings 7:1).
 - Do not ask how; let God do it.
3. Have faith in God.
 - The king's assistant answered Elisha, "Even if the Lord were to make windows in heaven, how could this happen?" Elisha replied, "You can see it with your own eyes, but you shall not eat of it" (2 Kings 7:2).
 - Without faith it is impossible to please God (Heb 11:6).
4. Speak Words of Faith.
 - Without faith it is impossible to please God (Heb 11:6).
 - We can move mountains by our spoken faith, believing without a doubt (Mk 11:22-25).
5. Be careful with what you say.
 - Believe with the heart and confess with the mouth (Rom 10:10).

- You have been snared by the utterance of your lips caught by the words of your mouth (Prov 6:2).
 - Prov 18:21, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue; those who make it a friend shall eat its fruit."
6. Read and study the Word.
 - Gods words are infallible.
 - Meditate on God's word day and night (Josh 1:8).
 - Blessed is the man whose joy is in God's words, who meditates on them day and night; whatever he does prospers (Ps 1:1-3).
 - In your statutes I take delight; I will never forget your word (Ps 119:16).
 - Remember God's words; teach them to your children (Dt 6:6-9).
 7. God gave man the ability to speak forth spirit and life words and to see the words become reality.
 - Stand firm and hold on to God's truths (2 Thess 2:15)
 - "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Mt 24:35).
 - "Incline your ears to my sayings; do not depart from your eyes for they are medicine to your bodies and health to your lives" (Prov 4:20-

The power that made creation is the same power at work when Samaria saw fulfillment of Elisha's prophecy. It is the same power entrusted today to all of us, His children. The power for the fulfillment of God's promised miracle is not in us; it is in God's spoken words.

Reflection: Do you know how to produce power through your mouth?

There is power in the written Word of God. Let us use it in prayer. Let us meditate on it unceasingly. Let us use it to fight our battles and win our victories.
