Enough means sufficient; nothing more is needed. It is adequate.

When we put our concerns in the hands of Jesus, we need not worry; He can take care of it in the best possible ways. Whatever we have will be enough. If we have little things in life, we should always be thankful. Since there is no scarcity in Jesus, we should set our minds on Him.

Three Things to Learn to Receive the Promises of God

- **1. Lean In.** Grab the opportunity without hesitation.
 - Nothing is impossible with Him, especially to those who obey faithfully. He can give our heart's desire. We know who our God is; He is more than we need.
 - We should always grab the opportunity
 Jesus is giving us; we should not question
 nor complain. We should not carry the
 burden. We just let him take care of it.
 - If we experience difficulties, we must remember that they have been allowed by the Lord so we will experience miracles. We must welcome even the opposition in the most inconvenient time; God is at work! Even if He wants us to wait, let us bear it patiently. God knows best!
 - He can make illnesses and financial distress an opportunity for miracles. Even brokenness He can mend! He wants to challenge us. We know what He can do and what He wants to do.
 - An example of how Jesus came into the rescue was the case of the Multiplication of Bread and Fish in John 6:1-14. Jesus and His disciples were across the Sea of Galilee when a large crowd was following Him because they saw the signs He was performing on the sick. To test His disciples, He told them, we had to feed all those with us. They reasoned out that there were too many and much money would be needed;

they suggested that they be driven away so they could find a place to eat. But Jesus disagreed, saying that they must eat first. He asked for the bread and fish and prayed for it and asked them to distribute these to the multitude. All had eaten well-filled and satisfied. The remnants were 12 wicker baskets. Imagine feeding all of them and having many leftovers! What a miracle!

2. Look Down

- We must develop the habit of seeing things not from our point of view but from a heavenly perspective. We must remember that everything is possible with Him. He can fill empty jars of oil up to the brim, even overflowing.
- Another incident when Jesus came into the rescue was The Wedding at Cana (John 2:1-11). The wine ran out in the middle of the party; hence Mary asked her Son to do something. Jesus, although reluctant to do it, was obliged to do so because He can't refuse His beloved Mother. His first miracle happened at the wedding; water was turned into wine. It was the most delicious wine. The newly-wedded were saved from embarrassment.

3. Listen

• The greatest resource is Jesus; listen to the voice of faith.

The Great Attributes of Jesus

- 1. the Bread of Life (John 6:35). When we eat His body and drink His blood, we will never hunger nor thirst.
- 2. The Light of the World (John 8:12). No darkness will come our way.
- 3. The Door (John 10:9). He can give us the way out.
- 4. The Good Shepherd (John 10:11). If we need direction, He can lead the way.
- 5. The Resurrection and the Life (John11:25-26). He rose from the dead; we will follow Him later.
- 6. The Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6). The only way leading us to eternal life.
- 7. The True Vine (John 15:5). The only one who can fix us whenever we are disconnected.

Conclusion: God is everything! Having Him, we will have more than enough. He alone can make miracles. Just believe in Him and obey! Putting our life in his palm should be our foremost decision.
