## Direct Line to God (Part 2)

We have equal access to the Lord. We can call Him directly. All of us have that right. We can ask for big things, not just toys but we can ask for continents. We can always ask for something that is impossible.

We have to have that prayerful thinking that we are children of God. As such, we have the privilege of coming before the Lord anytime to talk.

No matter who we are, we are all His children and He has no favorites. No one is given priority treatment. Anytime we come, He can hear us. His hands are not too short to reach out and save anybody for He is not bound by any distance, time, territory and places. He is omnipresent.

The Holy Spirit is the one who reminds all of us that we are heirs and adopted children of God. This is why when we pray, it is the Holy Spirit who reminds us that we have the right to ask God (Gal. 4:6). He reminds us of the Word of the Lord that we can always claim and possess.

When we consider God's heavens and the work of His fingers, we would wonder what is mankind that He is very mindful of (Ps. 8:3-4). This thinking would inspire us to have that prayerful thinking which leads us to purposefully thank God for all the blessings that He has given us.

Be mindful that although we have a direct line we can only receive if we give (Lk. 6:38). So, we must obey.

Reflection: Do we really believe that we are all children of God?

Do not ask only for little things because He is a generous Father. Since we are all children of God (Gal. 4:7), we are heirs to His promises. If we are being tested, it is because we are heirs of testing and victory (Rom. 8:16-17).

God is not our magic genie. The extreme is also wrong. But, He is God, all powerful, who possesses everything and reigns forever, who can give us more than what we desire.

Look at the promises of God for every need we have. When we think we need great faith in God, what we need is faith in a great God.

God wants us all to honor Him by praying without growing tired and giving up, and even though it is already taking time.

Reflection: Will you ask for toys or ask big things because God is a big God?

Ask God without inhibitions for nothing is impossible with Him.
