He is a God of blessings, provisions, and the impossible; so, He can bless us but it is up to us (Deut. 28). 5 Lies We Have Too Often Accepted

1. Blessing is dead. It is just "OT", old-fashioned and/or a myth.

2. Blessings are only for priests/clergy to give.

3. Blessings are only for God to give directly (from His hand to theirs).

4. Blessings are purely symbolic and contrived.

5. To bless is just to provide material and temporal things for others.

It is time to see these lies for what they are, lies. Anyone who has can be a blessing. Anyone of us can give blessings.

What is blessing?

It comes from the word, "Barak." In Hebrew, it means "to enrich", "to convey a gift", and "to add to that which is already good."

In Gen. 1:26-27, the Lord blessed us to be in His image and likeness.

What is the purpose and promise of God's blessing?

1. "Be fruitful and multiply." - Gen. 1:28
