"Important Questions That We Have To Ask Ourselves On Our Next Birthday"

"....until we all attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the extent of the full stature of Christ,...." (Ephesians 4:13)

Let us ask ourselves the following important questions on our next birthday:

1. Is my relationship with God healthy?

When we made Jesus Christ our personal Lord and Savior, we experienced the excitement, zealousness, and blazing fire within us. As years passed, did our relationship with God become much deeper or did it not?

"I know your works, your labor, and your endurance, and that you cannot tolerate the wicked; you have tested those who called themselves apostles but are not, and discovered that they are impostors. Moreover, you have endurance and have suffered for my name, and you have not grown weary. Yet I hold this against you: you have lost the love you had at first. Realize how far you have fallen...." (Revelations 2:2-5)

Our birthdays provide a lot of opportunities to enlarge our vision in becoming Christ-like. Another year in age does not equal another year in growth. Have we been growing in maturity? The Lord always *looks into our heart*. (1 Samuel 16:7)
