Judges 13:1-2

• The Israelites who obeyed the Lord started to sin, so God delivered them into the hands of their enemies. Thus, they went through the cycle of sin, judgment and deliverance.

Judges 13:5

God allows things to happen in our lives to show us that He can deliver/heal us from sickness. In dire need, He alone can provide for us.

Judges 13:6-8, 13

 More often than not, God does not give us the details; He would just give us enough instructions, and then He lets us wait. Let us learn to trust Him, and watch how He moves.

Judges 13:9-12

Judges 14:1-3

How to make a bad decision?

 Pivot to the wrong place. Here are some places to avoid when making a decision: our emotions, needs, pressure, opinions of others, and our own logic.

We should be grounded in the Word of God, to be in the right place at the right time with the right people doing the right thing. Let us see what God says about our situation in the Scriptures: *"But I'll* take the hand of those who don't know the way, who can't see where they're going. **I'll be a personal** guide to them, directing them through unknown country" (Is 42:16).

- What is most scary about making a decision is the unknown, but God has secured our future; He will lead and guide us to the right path because His plan never fails.
- 2. Pivot to the wrong focus. When we are making decision(s), let's not trust ourselves. "Trust in the Lord completely." (Prov 3:5)
- 3. **Pivot away from God.** Samson rejected the godly counsel of his parents. We should know that God brings godly people into our lives to help u,s so we should listen to them.
