A. Reasons Why People Give Up:

- Frustration / Burnout Burnout is physical, emotional, or mental exhaustion. People who are exhausted are most likely to give up. Many individuals become frustrated when expectations are not met, progress is slow, or obstacles arise.
- Running out of patience In order to be able to persevere in times of difficulties, one must recognize that setbacks and failures are part of life. Thus, it is necessary to be steadfast and patient, and focus on the goal.
- 3. Lack of or misplaced motivation To be motivated, we need to love what we are doing. There must be genuine interest and enthusiasm for what we are pursuing. In our ministry, if there is no love for God, giving up would be easy. Whatever we do, we must do with a happy heart.
- B. The Story of Job: He had a comfortable life; he was prosperous. He was an upright, faithful, and blessed man. God allowed Satan to test Job. Everything was taken away from Job: family, possessions, and health. Even his wife urged him to denounce God, but Job protested and endured his suffering. Instead, he said, "The Lord has given, the Lord has taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job 1: 21-22). In the end, God intervened and restored all that Job lost.
