


Can They See Jesus in Me?

1. No One Saw Jesus in Peter That Night

1.1. Peter was asked about Jesus, but he abandoned Him and vehemently denied Him. He hurriedly left when asked about Jesus because he was scared.

1.2. We can be Peter who was afraid to declare his association with Jesus and his being a follower of Christ.

1.3. Peter followed Jesus, but not until the very end.

2. We were invited by the Lord because He wants us to be His reflection

2.1. We are the ones He created who can really show the character of Jesus to others.

2.2. We are the ones who they can hear when we talk and can encourage people to hear the voice of Jesus in us.

2.3. We are the ones capable of reflecting the glory of God in our lives.

2.4. We should be the light of the world and salt of the earth (Matthew 5:13). Jesus is no longer with us physically, but He is present in us and amongst us.

2.5. As mirror of the Lord, we must reflect the beauty, glory, image and holiness of God (2 Corinthians 3:18).

2.6. We should inspire people. They should hear Jesus in us.

2.7. Many of us are listening to God's Words. The call to action is to apply the teachings of Christ in our life; to stand up, strengthen us in the middle of trials.

2.8. Everyone who is renewed is living the new life of Jesus (2 Corinthians 5:17).

2.9. We are to be the lights for Christ in a dark world.

2.10. We serve as lights in our homes and to our children who may be confused and guide them with the truth. Our light must shine before others that they may see our good deeds and glorify the Father in heaven.

2.11. We must be the walking, breathing and living testimony of our Lord to the life-changing power of Jesus.

3.1. Transformation (Luke 5:1-8). Peter became a fisher of men. We are also lost until the Lord finds us and changes our ways.

3.2. Peter acknowledged Jesus as the Son of God (Matthew 16:13-18). Let us recognize His appointed leaders.

3.3. Jesus is changing us since we turn our lives to Him (Luke 6:44).

3.4. Let us be good Samaritans - giving time, paying attention, sharing our smiles, tapping people's back.

4. Bearing Fruit and Imitating the Character of the Lord (Galatians 5:22). Our lives are testimonies to Jesus' glory (Galatians 5:22).

5. Three Basic Types of Fruits That the Lord Bears in the Lives of His Children

5.1. Sanctification – We become more like Him. (Romans 6:22, Colossians 1:10)

5.2. Spirituality - We behave more like Him. (Galatians 5: 22-23)

5.3. Souls – We are burdened like Him. (Romans 1:13)

6. Peter fell into sin. We are just as vulnerable to sin. Be wary of the factors that led Peter to fall:

6.1. Avoid the wrong places and situations.

6.3. Avoid the wrong people (1 Corinthians 15:3).

6.3. Do not give the wrong performance (Mark 14:71)
