

## **You Ain't Seen Nothing Yet**

As we start 2026, a lot of people are excited about what's coming; but some are quite apprehensive because 2025 was probably not a good year. However, if we trust God, we know He has sorted out everything for us this year. He is also progressive, building, and working behind the scenes with His mighty hand. Moreover, He is a God of new splendid things, always changing His ways to do something new for us, though His character does not change. "Behold, I will do a new thing now! It shall spring forth..." (Isa. 43:19). Hence, let us be excited and be ready with great anticipation. God is just about to "WOW" us because we haven't seen nothing yet.

**1. Our God does not know the word "impossible."** (Mt 19:26). When we look at our life, we only see a limited view of life (everyday crisis, trials, bad situations). However, God sees the not-so-good seasons as perfect backdrops to display His glory and His power. What looks like a setback, is actually a set-up for God's breakthrough.

**2. Jesus turns what seems to be breakdowns into breakthroughs:**

**2.1 No wine in the wedding (Jn. 2).** In ancient times, running out of wine would have embarrassed the groom and the bride, but Jesus turned six (6) jars of water into the best-tasting (priceless) wine. He made the impossible possible.

**2.1.1** God who is the same today works and saves the best for us. He's turning what is bad into good, and the good, to the best case. However, key to such a breakthrough is obedience to God.

**2.2 Jairus daughter who was at the point of death (Mk. 5).** Jairus asked Jesus to come and heal his daughter, but Jesus was delayed by a bleeding woman. Thus, the daughter died and the father felt grief, hopelessness and pain. Jesus eventually went to Jairus'

house and told the child to get up and she did (Mk. 5:39-41).

**2.2.1** When we feel like it is the end and God asks us to wait, He has made the hopeless case into a "wow" opportunity to manifest His glory. What we think is permanent, (overwhelming problems or desperation) is only temporary.

**2.2.2** Today, Jesus is telling us, "Get up!" when our problems take us down. We must be ready to receive the wondrous things that God is doing for us. He restores us, gives us peace, and amazes us.

**2.2.3** His best is not the absence of trouble. He may not get us out of our season yet, but He is with us. Even if we know that we are in a bad situation, we are in the best company ever. He is walking through our valleys, our darkest moments.

**2.3 Dead Lazarus (Jn. 11).** Jesus heard about His friend's sickness but He did not go immediately. He wanted to use that backdrop to show that He is the "resurrection and the life."

**2.3.1** Sometimes, we sound like Martha: "Why does the Lord allow bad things to happen?" Let us look at our God who can make everything possible! He can turn nothingness into exponential things.

**2.4 The Red Sea (Exodus).** The Israelites were trapped in the middle of the army and the Red Sea. When they thought there was no way, God showed them a highway.

**Conclusion:** Let us walk 2026 by faith, not by sight. Faith sees the bad things as opportunities to be "wowed" by God. Faith does not fear even in the darkest valley. Faith believes when there's no reason to believe. Faith sees God bigger than whatever we think is big. Our God is on the move and up to something great, far beyond our imagination.
