Just as God created the world with His words, we who are made in His image can release divine power by speaking His promises. The power of God backs us up when we dare to speak the word with faith, love, authority, and expectation. Thus, we ought to be glad to share what God has done for us.

### 1. God established physical and spiritual laws:

1.1. **Physical Laws.** We learn to respect the physical laws in the universe (e.g. the Law of Gravity) because we know there are causes and consequences if we deliberately violate them.

1.2. **Spiritual Laws.** God separated light from darkness, what is allowed and what is prohibited. Just like Adam and Eve, who disobeyed God's command, we will experience hardship once separated from Him. Conversely, obedience brings abundant blessings.

### 2. The consequences of obedience and disobedience are shown in the story of King Ben-Hadad and the prophet Elisha (2 Kings 6).

2.1 The nation of Israel had broken the laws of God. They were suffering because of their misdeeds, and the misguided king wanted to blame Elisha. Similarly, we also blame God or others when misfortune befalls us.

2.2 The king vowed to take off the head of Elisha. They had forsaken God despite Elisha's warning; hence God removed the providential care from them.

2.3 The king kept his eyes upon the circumstances and problems instead of taking his greater need to God (2 Cor. 4:18). Truly, we should fix our eyes on Jesus rather than on our problems (Heb. 12:2).

2.4 The king could only see the misery (2 Kings 6:31). He was devastated upon hearing the story of the two mothers.

2.5 Elisha's prophetic words and influence were connected to the nation's troubles; he prophesied the famine. It was a warning from the Lord, which the king ignored. God is more powerful than our problems. With faith, nothing is impossible to us.

2.6 The king sent his messenger to take off (2 Kings 6:32). The king vowed to kill Elisha, but Elisha had providential protection.

2.7 Elisha received divine information (2 Kings 6:8-23). He thwarted an Aramean army plotting to capture him. After God blinded the enemy, he instructed the king of Israel to feed the captives and release them, bringing peace to the nation.

2.8 Elisha prophesied (2 Kings 7:1). Elisha was given the word of knowledge and informed the officer that there would be lots of flour and barley at a low price. It was a fantastic promise from God's prophet. Indeed, God wants to give us mighty things for His glory.

2.9 The officer mocked the promise of God. We see miracles happening to others, but they do not happen in our lives because of our lack of faith.

2.10 There is a miracle in our mouth. Our words have an enormous creative power. When we quote God's Word in our prayers, we are claiming His every word.

**Conclusion:** Spoken words – particularly, confessions aligned with Scripture – possess the power to change circumstances, bring healing, and alter destinies. The moment we speak, we give birth to it. We should walk by faith and not by sight (2 Cor. 5:7).

**Reflection:** How do you respond to your circumstances? How can you conquer your fears, worries?
